What is plagiarism?

- Making use of other people's ideas, words, creative works and expressions without giving credit or listing source
- Repeating an idea expressed by someone else, and not giving credit
- It can be verbatim, changing a word or two, or even paraphrasing or summarizing
- "If you are incorporating an author's ideas into your paper, or if the work of another has influenced your thinking on a topic, then the source must be cited."



Paraphrasing and Quoting

- Difference
 - Quoting use the author's exact words
 - Paraphrasing use the author's ideas but put them in your own words

What is not plagiarism?

- Common knowledge
 - A rule of thumb is if a fact can be found in 3 or more sources.
- Expressing an idea in your own words, and giving credit
- Using a direct quote, and giving credit
- Stating a fact, and giving credit
- Paraphrasing or summarizing, and giving credit

- Learn principles of good writing so you have skills to express your ideas with your own words
 - Poor writing skills often result in unintentional plagiarism
- Learn how to paraphrase a source with your own words
 - Read, write it in your own words, compare it with what you read earlier in the source document, and refine your writing
 - Make sure to cite the source document
- Learn how to cite sources properly
 - Choose a citation style (APA, IEEE, ...) suitable for your discipline



- Learn what plagiarism is and what it is not
- Don't assume what you know is "common knowledge" for everyone—it may not be.
 - You may need to cite some things you think are "common knowledge."
- Don't misinterpret or manipulate what was intended in a source to suit your needs
 - Applies not only to text, but also to charts, graphs, images, and video.



- When using citations collected from secondary sources, make sure those citations actually exist and find out what was really conveyed in those cited sources so that you are not reproducing someone else's misinterpretation
- Obtain permission from authors when using large portions of their text and give them due credit in your writing
- When in doubt, put the text within quotes and include citations



- Developing good research habits, good time management, and taking responsibility for your own learning.
- Don't postpone with your research
 - Good research takes time
 - Postponing makes it likely you'll run out of time or be unduly pressured to finish.

- Common uses during research projects
 - Review grant proposals to discover any overlap in content or intent prior to submitting the proposal to secure necessary funding
 - Do a literature review to discover and evaluate the work already present in the field.
 - Continuously review manuscript drafts to identify and resolve any citation errors
 - Collaborate with co-authors, peers, or editors as the manuscript is reviewed and revised
 - Ensure that the final work, whether grant proposal, dissertation/thesis, or journal article protects the author and institution's reputation
